- 7.3 In the absence of regular committee members, any member of Council may fill a vacancy to ensure the duties of the committee are fulfilled.

Part III STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY

<u>;</u> DECLARATION OF A STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY (SOLE)

- The Advisory Committee to be known as the "Local Emergency Committee" power to declare a SOLE in Lethbridge County in accordance with ACT is hereby delegated to a sub-committee of the Emergency
- 10.2 The Local Emergency Committee shall be comprised of the chair of the Committee, or the person acting in place of the chair of the committee.
- 10.3 The Local Emergency Committee may call a meeting without notice
- 10.4 Quorum for the Local Emergency Committee shall be one
- 10.5 the motion for such resolution is not required to be seconded or to declared in a public meeting. The Local Emergency Committee shall declare a SOLE by resolution, and be
- 10.6 The declaration of the SOLE under this Part shall identify the nature of the emergency and the area of the County in which it exists.

- 10.8 Immediately after the Local Emergency Committee makes the declaration of a SOLE, the Committee shall cause the details of the declaration to be published by such means of communication as it considers is most likely to make known to the population of the County affected by the contents of declaration of a SOLE
- 10.9 The Local Emergency Committee shall report to the next meeting of of the County in which it exists or existed Council the nature of the SOLE, the reasons for so declaring and the area
- 5 .10 Upon declaration of a SOLE and for the duration of the SOLE, the Director, may, in accordance with the Act, exercise and perform all of the powers and duties given to a local authority by the Act.
- 10.11 At all other times, and except as otherwise provided in this Bylaw, the ಠ Committee shall exercise and perform all of the powers and duties a local authority by the Act. given

- 10.13 A declaration of a SOLE is considered terminated and ceases to be any force or effect when: 앜

- 10.13.2 A period of 90 days if the declaration is in respect of a pandemic;
 10.13.3 If a declaration of a state of local emergency has been made, an order under section 18(1) of the Emergency Management Act for a state of emergency by the Lieutenant Governor in Council relating q or effect. declaration of a state of local emergency ‡ e same area of the municipality may ceases to be of any force provide that
- 10.13.4 The Minister cancels the state of local emergency

10.14 When a declaration of a SOLE has been terminated, the local authority who made the declaration shall cause the details of the termination to be published immediately by such means of communication considered most likely to notify the population of the area affected.
